At their request, the cremated remains of David Ramsey and Edna Shewcraft Macon will be interred at Coleman Cemetery, Murfreesboro, Tennessee, on Sunday, April 30, at 3:00 p.m. They were married for 57 years and are survived by their son, David Lee Macon III, of Belleville, Illinois. Both were members of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Owensboro, Kentucky.

David Ramsey Macon was born on August 19, 1931, in Rutherford County. The son of Archie and Melissa Weeks Macon, Ramsey was the grandson of country music legend, David Harrison "Uncle Dave" Macon. He was a veteran of the Korean War and retired from the Army Chemical Corps as a lieutenant colonel. A dedicated educator, Ramsey taught math, physics, chemistry and computer science in the Metro Nashville School System, retiring from Hume-Fogg Academic High School in 1986. He will always be remembered for his good sense of humor and willingness to help others, especially those in need. Ramsey was one of the founders of the "Uncle Dave Macon Days" festival, now

in its fortieth year. He passed away in Owensboro, Kentucky, on August 20, 2016, at age 85 after a brief illness.

Edna Lee Shewcraft Macon was born on March 19, 1928, in Crittenden County, Kentucky, to the late Luther Francis and Oda Lee Patton Shewcraft. She was a Korean War era veteran of the Women's Army Corps, achieving the rank of First Lieutenant. A trained librarian, she retired from the Nashville Public School System. An avid gardener and genealogist, Edna was a proud, active member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. She passed away at the Western Kentucky Veterans Center in Hanson, Kentucky, on June 12, 2013, following an extended illness. She was 85.
