FELICE WITZTUM for outstanding intellectual leadership in personal achievement and active participation in organizations which foster such development. By working in the library five years, she has acquired a comprehensive knowledge of the purposes and functions of a library program. Her participation has been varied and thorough. Under her leadership the Library Lassies were organized and have successfully planned and carried out many projects to enrich the school curriculum.

Felice was named among The Top Ten girls in Davidson County Forensics last year. She has placed first in every city or county contest she has entered. She will represent Madison in the State-Wide debate competition this year as she has the past three years. Felice is the Vice-Pres. of the N. F. L. Chapter and holds the highest honor, the Degree of Distinction. She is the D. A. R. Medalist and a finalist in The National Merit Scholarship competition.

PEGGY WILLIAMS for her un-assuming and dependable leadership, active participation, and unusual achievement in the library program and forensics. She has worked in the library four years. Her patient manner, clear explanations, accurate work, and high standards of achievement make her unusually efficient in training others as well as helping students and teachers in selecting and using materials. She was a leader in organizing the LIBRARY LASSIES and is the first secretary.

Peggy has worked diligently for the past four years with the forensic club and the N. F. L. Chapter, is president and holds the Degree of Distinction, the highest honor. She has represented the school the past three years in both county and state debate competition, and will again represent the school this year. Peggy attended the Russellville Kentucky Speech Tournament this year, going to the finals in both extempore and declamation. She maintains a high scholastic average and is a member of the Honor Society, as well as being active in her church.



EILEEN WALDEN for unusual creative ability which she has unstintingly used in the library, her classrooms, and in the corridors. For four years she has headed the display staff of the library. Her catchy ideas, skillful construction, artistic lay-outs, and able book selections have made the library an attractive and interesting place to visit and have intrigued students into reading more books. She designed the official symbols of the LIBRARY LASSIES—the plaid-clad lassie and the membership card.

Eileen also has exceptional talent for creative writing. Her poems and essays, which have been published in high school anthologies, have brought honor to her and to her school. For two years in succession she has received special mention for poems which were published in "The National Anthology of High School Poetry."

His participation in Forensics has made him a competent announcer and rounds out his mastery of the functions of his machines. We salute him for winning the 1958 WMAK-Pure Oil Company Sports-caster Award for his sports-casting of all the Madison High football games.

In Memoriam



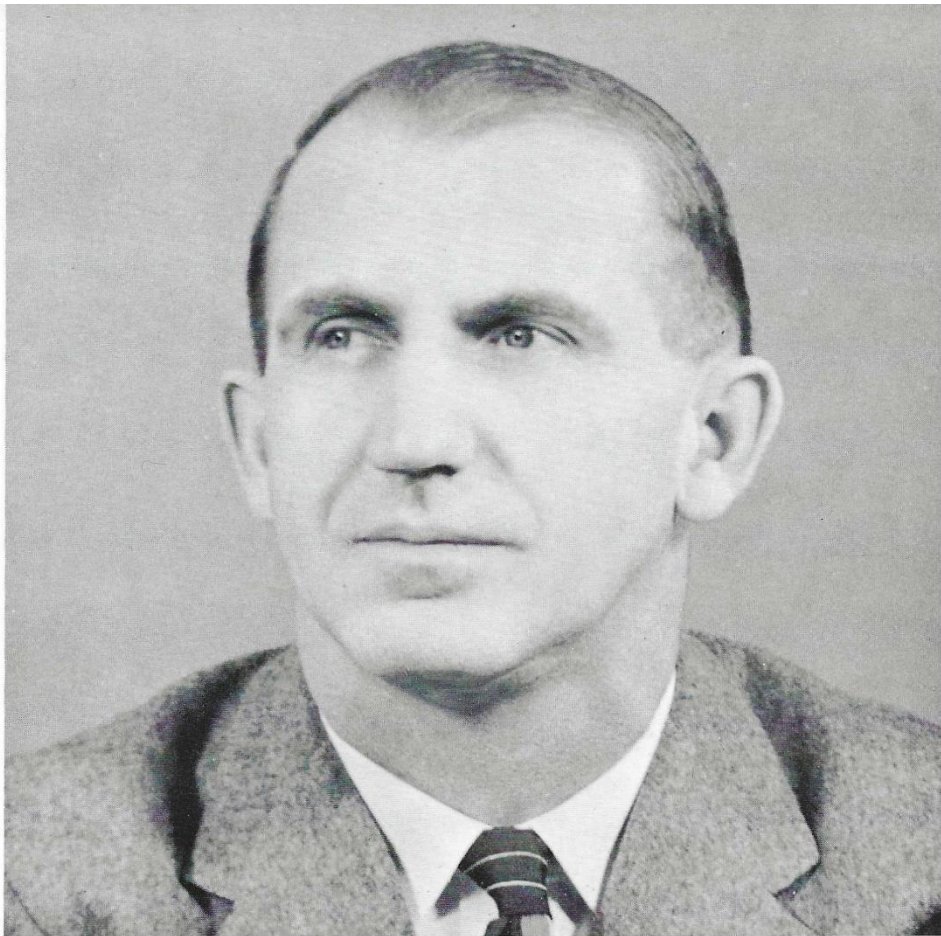
On March 10, 1959, we received a message at Madison High School that made our hearts heavy—mortal life was over for Mrs. Wilna Marshall Alexander.

Indeed her life exemplified the simple counsel of the Prophet Micah: "To do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

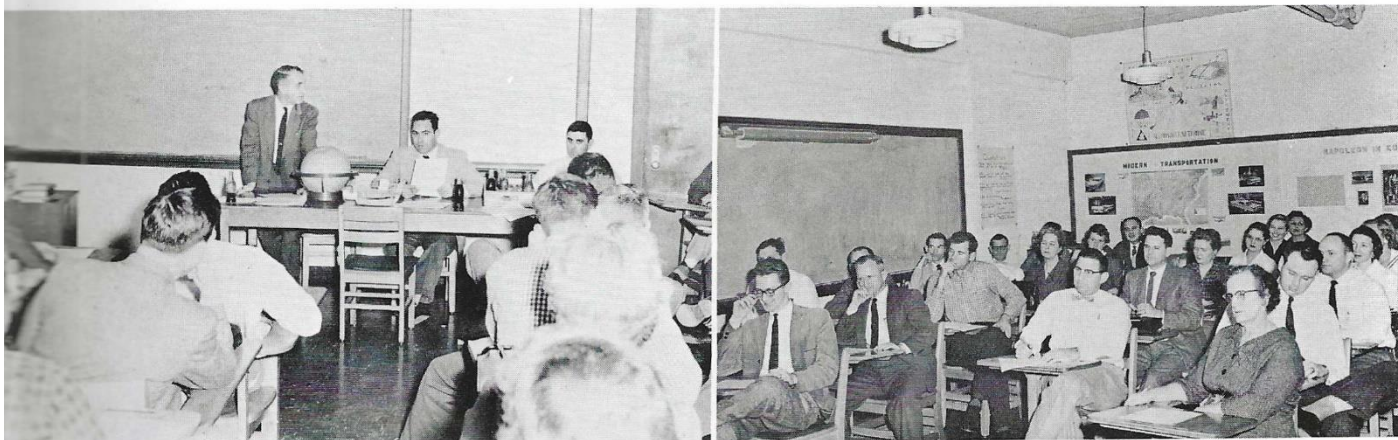


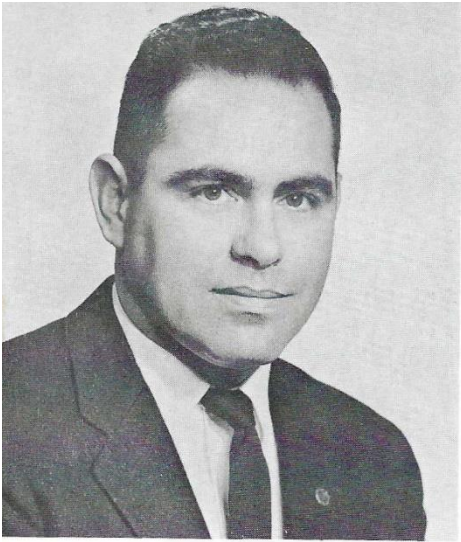

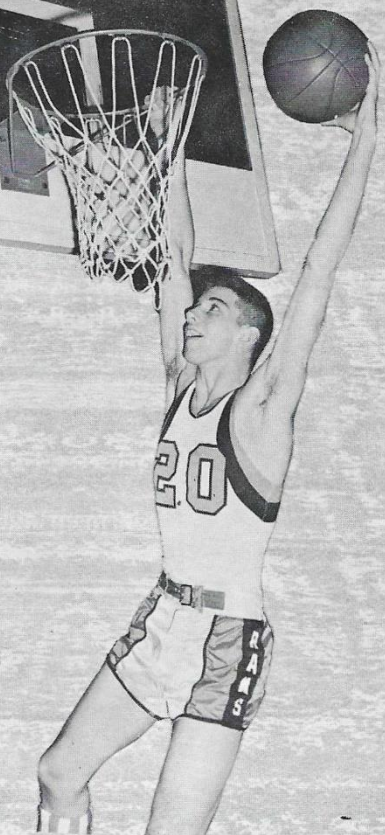
This year the Rams lose only Smith and Guard Ira Frye from the starting five. Although they leave key positions to be filled, next year's squad should be better balanced and more experienced.
