Because of the combined efforts of the faculty and the Student Council, the year 1959-1960 has been one of the most successful years for Madison High School in all its aspects.

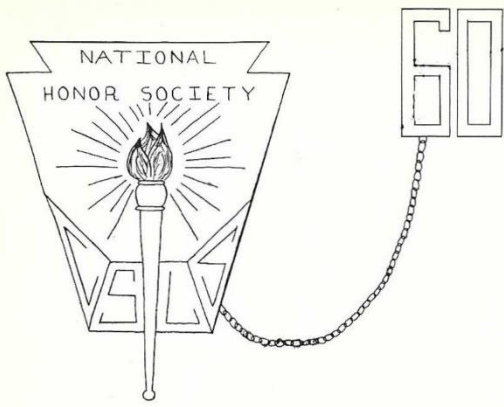

court, and other socials. The excellent service rendered by our various committees has enabled the Council to function so efficiently.

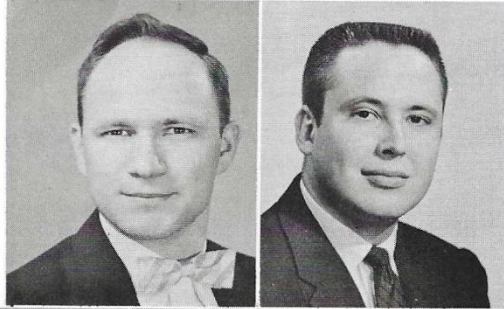
Our school handbook has been revised and brought up-to-date this year. The handbook gives adequate information about the curriculum, general organization, policies, and activities of the school.

The LIBRARY LASSIES organize a recruiting program in the spring for additions to the staff. Representatives visit all seventh grade home rooms and discuss the work of student library assistants; personal contacts are made to reach people in the eighth and ninth grades. Applicants are interviewed by a reviewing committee of the Library Lassies; their recommendations are passed on to Mrs. Wiley for final selection.

In the fall all eighth grade workers are put under the supervision of an experienced Library Lassie for a year's training; this includes instruction work assignments checking the performance of each trainee, and personal conferences with individual workers or Mrs. Wiley. In the spring trainees are scheduled for full time work at the circulation desk.

The formal Induction Service is held in March for all beginners who meet the requirements for membership in the Library Lassies. At this service all experienced workers who have qualified are also

awarded annual membership cards.

Experienced assistants are assigned to specialized work according to interests and abilities such as display, lettering books, mending, filing, compiling statistics, preparing bibliographies, and assisting students and teachers in selecting and locating materials. Emphasis is placed upon helping students. Each added year of library work makes an assistant a more valued school investment.

The Constitution, By-Laws require the LIBRARY LASSIES to plan and conduct at least one outside program for faculty members at the beginning of school and one for students during Book Week. Each Library Lassie must participate in a specified number of projects. All projects are planned and conducted on the students free time and are in addition to the regular scheduled routine library work.

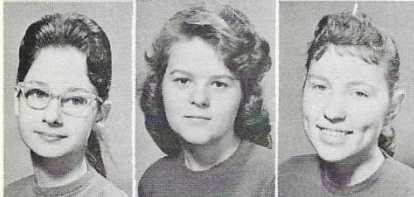

National Forensic League

Madison High School's National Forensic League has been active since its beginning four years ago. It has officially been the fastest growing chapter in the state for the past three years, and largest in the state since 1958. In both 1957 and 1958 Madison was represented in the state finals, and in 1958 it sent its first representative to nationals.

This chapter has placed in the top four in the state competitive since 1957, when the chapter was started by Mrs. Rosalie D. Looney. It has never placed less than third in county competition; last year and this year, Madison has received first in the county.

Madison's NFL Chapter has participated very successfully in the annual county play contest. It has always placed at least one member on the all-star cast, averaging at least one outstanding actor or actress award. This year it will receive both these

awards. In four years of participation Madison has twice placed second; this year it was unanimously voted first in the county, placing four members on the all-star cast.

Participation in Forensic activities is not limited by grade, but to those who are willing to work toward perfection of speaking ability. This offers opportunities to everyone. The officers are chosen according to their superior work gauged by the number of points received in contest participation. Contestants are limited to 500 points, excluding state and national contests, during their forensic career. Madison will have graduating students next year who have reached this limit.

The Madison National Forensic League Chapter is destined to become one of the largest and most outstanding chapters in the country.
