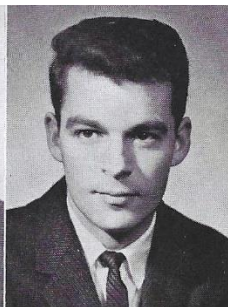
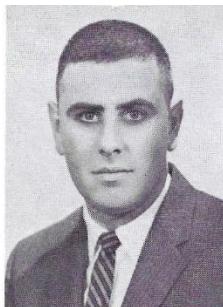
DEDICATION

Rams Bury Burros

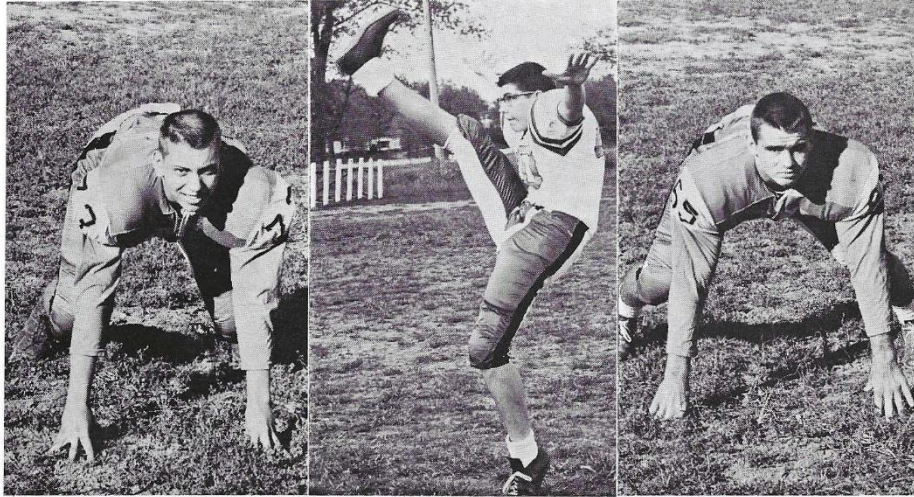
