






Ram quarterback, Alex Beavers, crashes through the Spartan defense for another score.








Bob Chaffin finds a gaping hole it the Don forward wall.

The Donelson Dons, ranked as one of the state's top teams, suffered their only defeat of the season as they bowed 20-19 to a determined Ram team.


The big Orange jolted the Dons in the first half as Robert Birdsong scored on a 3-yard run and Mike McDonald kicked the extra point.





With their best over-all effort of the season, the Madison Rams tripped the favored Ryan eleven with a crushing 20-0 victory over the Irish.






