It was great to see the familiar faces and hear the voices of the gang. Soon you found yourself falling into a routine, and things really didn't seem so different from last year.

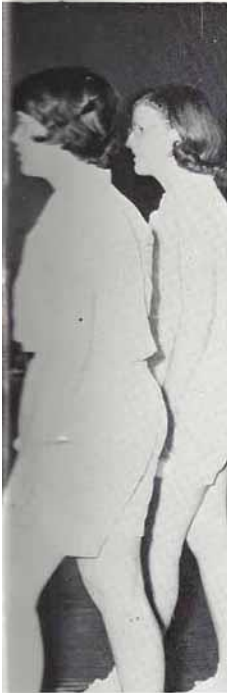

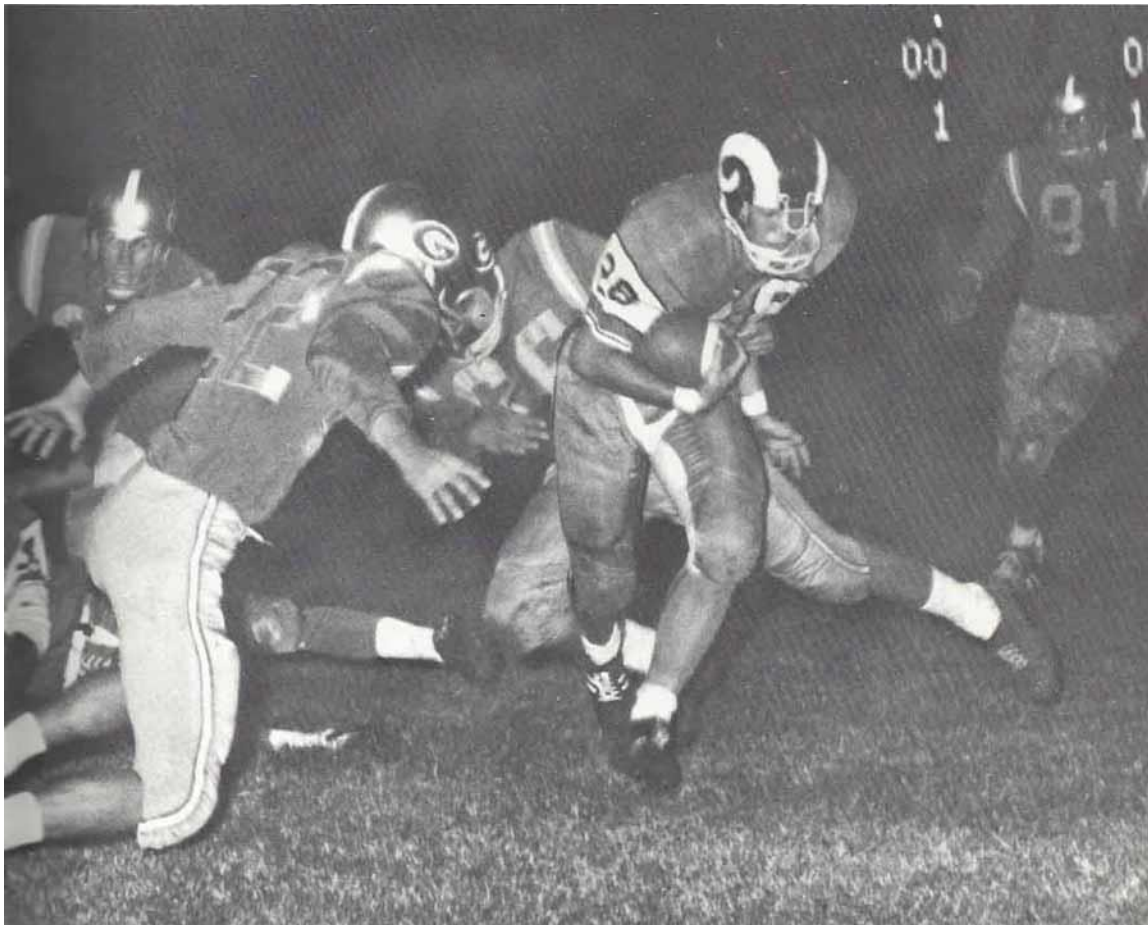

## Big "M" Shines

Predicted to lose by ten points, the Rams surprised unbeaten Cameron in the last game of the season with a 14-13 upset that finished the Panther's hopes for the Eastern Division Title and Clinic Bowl bid.

The defense, led by Jimmy Cartwright with 25 tackles, held the Panthers to only 196 total yardage. Gerald Grant, Craig Carter, and John Gray also added to Cameron's dilemma giving spectacular performances in the line for the Rams.

## In 14-13 Upset Win Over Cameron

Steve Estep, Ram quarterback, headed Madison's offense which totaled 145 yards rushing and 119 passing. Estep and Eddie Carroll shined in the backfield for the Big Orange, both with large gains in the air and on the ground.

Cameron tallied two quick touchdowns early in the 1st quarter, but the Big Orange would not be stopped. Determination and real team effort gave the rest of the game to the Rams.

An 11-yard pass to Craig Carter from Estep for the TD and another toss to Terry Mathis for the PAT altered the score to 13-7 at halftime. Using every

play that the orange-clad men had mastered, Coach Bill Brimm and his fighting team kept the opposing team continually confused defensively. A play improvised during a time out yielded the winning TD.

Late in the 4th Quarter, Mike Santi jolted the six yards to tie the score and a throw to Phil North gave the Rams the winning point.

Team performance and determination reigned victorious as Madison pulled out with a one-point edge over undefeated Cameron. The Rams ended the year 4 - 5 - 1 with three consecutive wins and the sweetest victory of the year.

The rip-roaring Rams journeyed to Two Rivers looking for a victory. Fired up with spirit and determination, the Rams romped over the Pirates 13-0.

The offense had a spectacular night compiling an amazing 306 yards total offense.

Reed Hawkins rushed for 88 yards with David Belt close behind at 85.

Hawkins started things off in the first half by scoring a touchdown. The extra point was missed and the score was 6-0. Two Rivers marched down the field several times only to be stopped cold in Ram territory. The second half Madison capped a drive with David Belt going 3 yards for the touchdown. The extra point was good on a run by Belt.

John Gray, Fred Najjar, Ricky Sloan, and Billy Rucker added that extra punch to the defense which kept Two Rivers from scoring.

Gerald Grant, Reed Hawkins, and Jimmy Cartwright placed on the NIL checklist for their performance against the pirates.

## Ram Surge Stopped In Donelson Tilt

Even after making a brilliant come-from-behind surge, the Rams ran out of time and fell short to Donelson 20-13.

Madison beat the Dons every way except in points. The Rams had 17 first downs to Donelson's 7. The Rams also racked up 290 yards total offense which was far better than the Dons.

Donelson did all of their scoring the first half making it 20-0 going into the dressing room at half-time. When the second half began the Rams started their long trip uphill. Reed Hawkins scored first making the score 20-6.

Steve Young added the point after touchdown. Eddie Carroll came into the spotlight in the fourth quarter by scoring on a 2-yard plunge. The extra point was missed and the score stood 20-13. With time running out the Rams headed for the goal line again but never crossed over. The game ended 20-13 with the Rams fighting until the final whistle.

Reed Hawkins grounded out 84 yards rushing while Eddie Carroll and David Belt added 66 and 51 yards respectively.

For their outstanding play, Fred Najar and Reed Hawkins were placed on the NIL checklist.



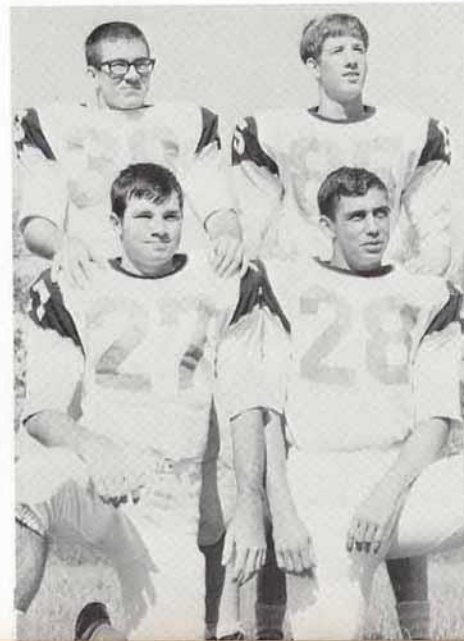

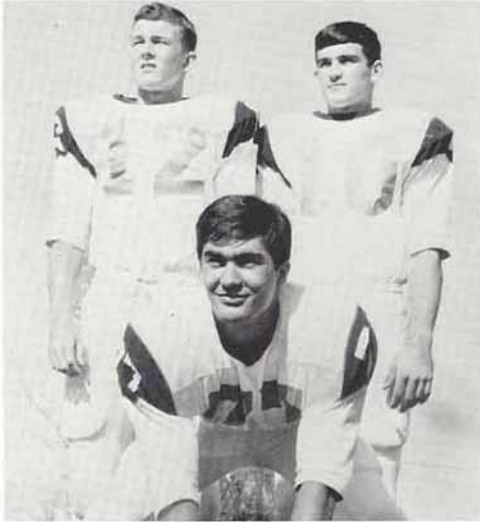

Homecoming activities seemed to be caught up in a whirlwind as Madison trounced the Gallatin Green Wave 26-0.

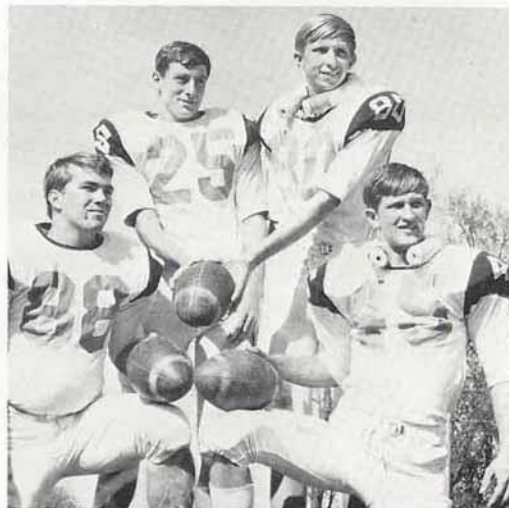

Eddie Carroll, Shorty Sloan, Houston Reagan, and Owen Joyner spotlighted the defensive attack.

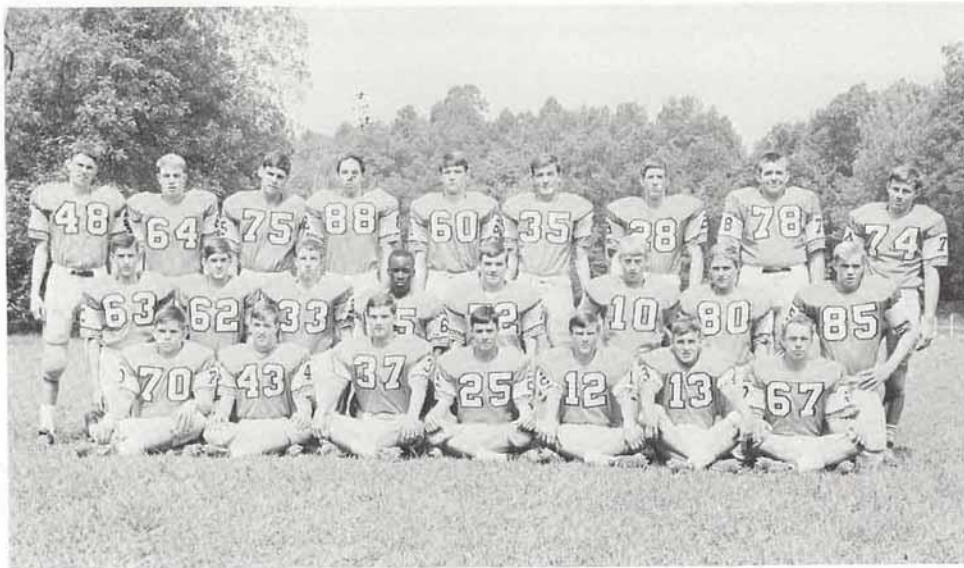

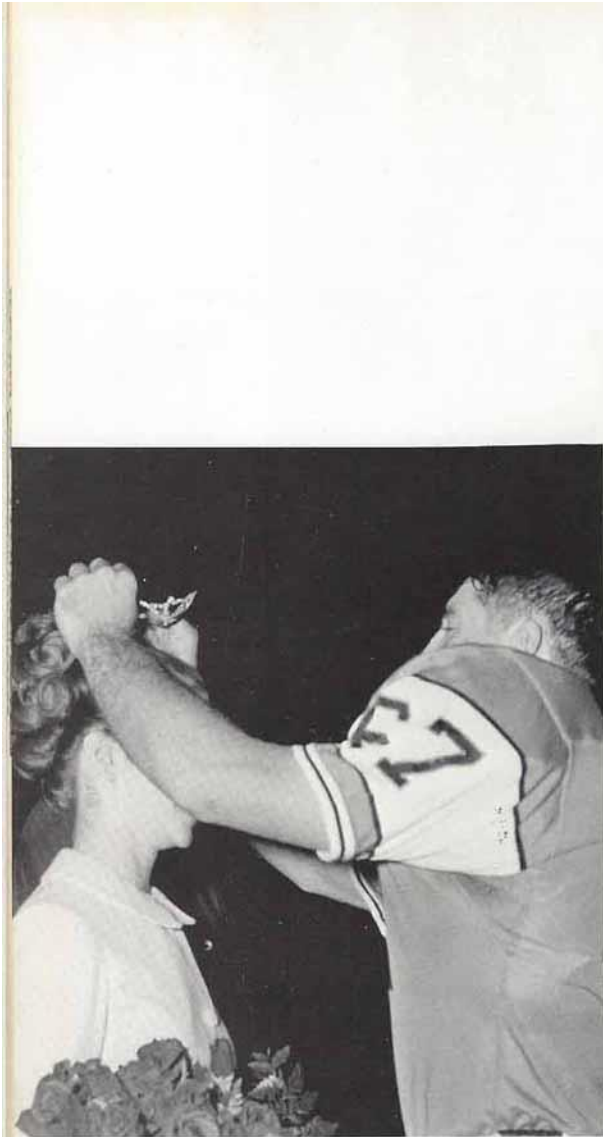

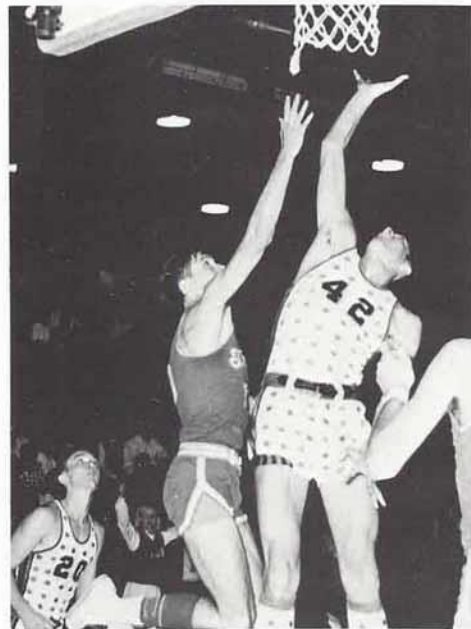

After 2 more defeats, the Ramettes met Joelton again, this time ready to win. Determination paid off with the final score 49-42 in favor of the Rams.

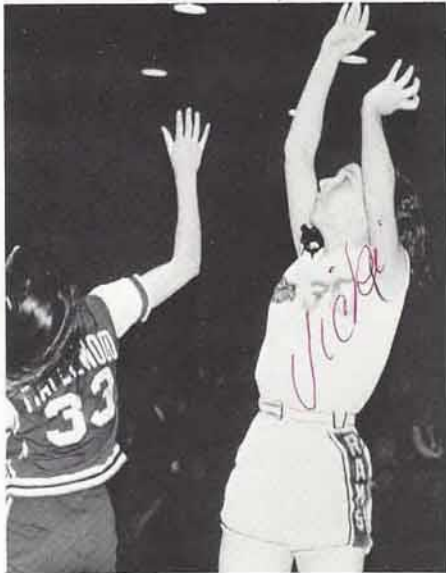

For season averages, Vicki Lance and Becky Peacher bucketed twenty points a game while Dottie Hale led the team in foul shots.

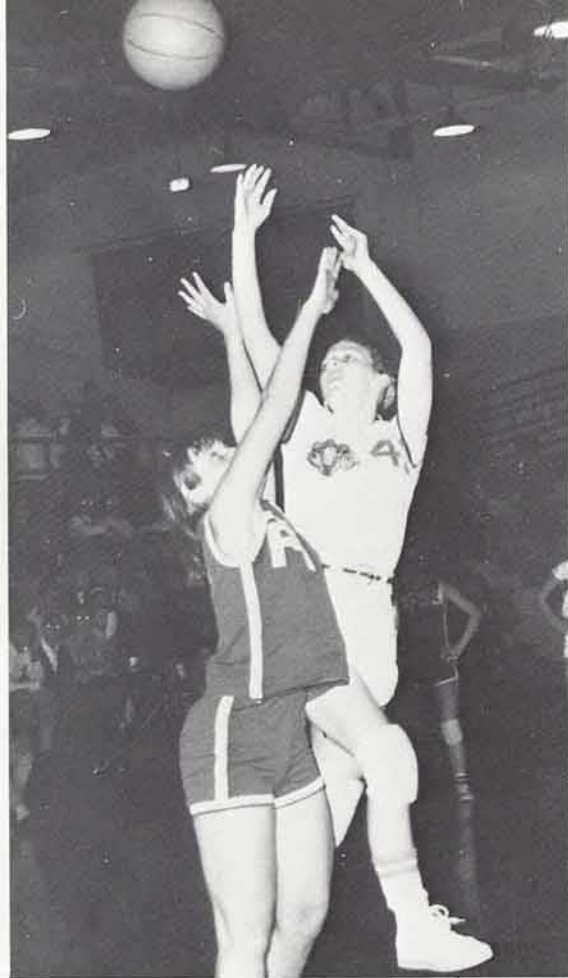

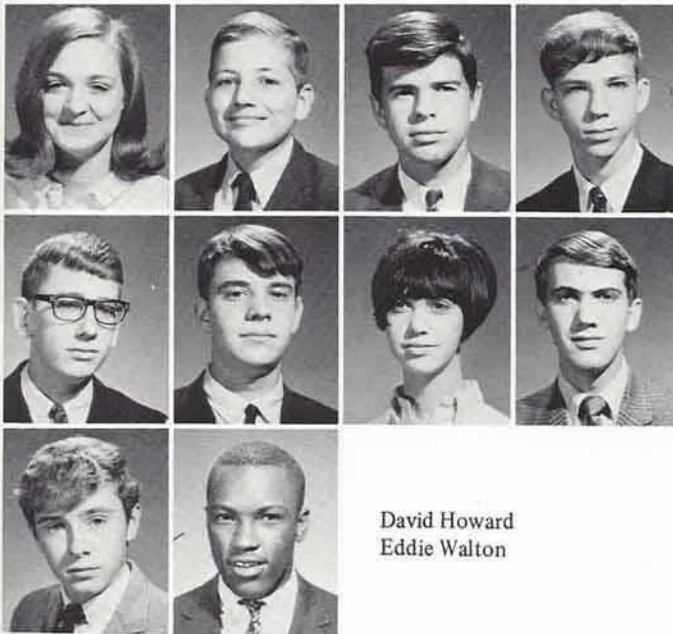
## Thespians Produce "Barefoot in the Park"

Spring sports have become increasingly important at Madison. With the enthusiasm of the athletes, these sports gained popularity in 1968.



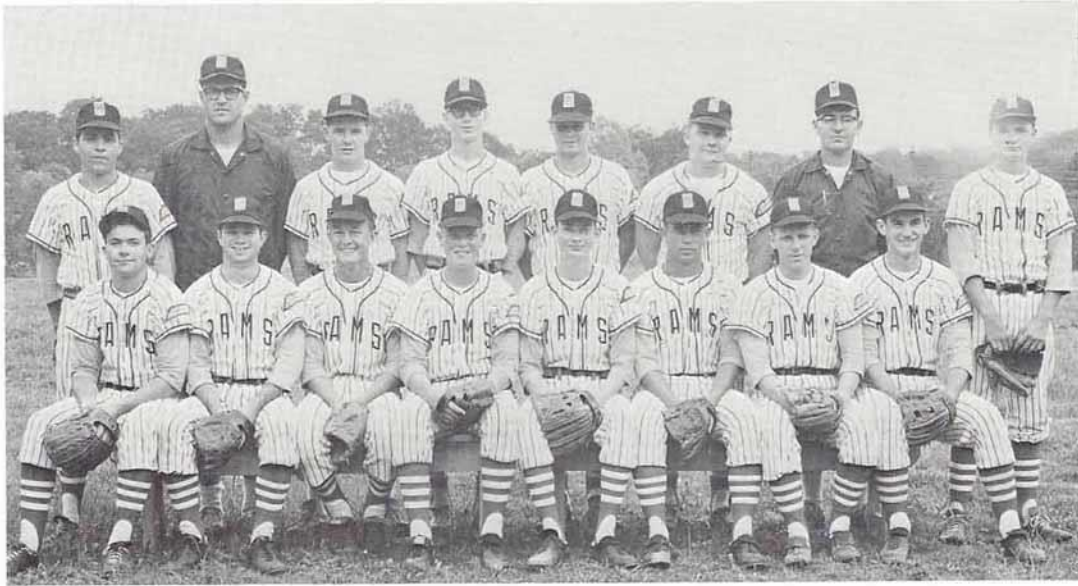

Regional play again pitted the Big Orange against M.B.A. Winning this game 5-1, the Rams were on the road to Kingsport and the State Tournament.

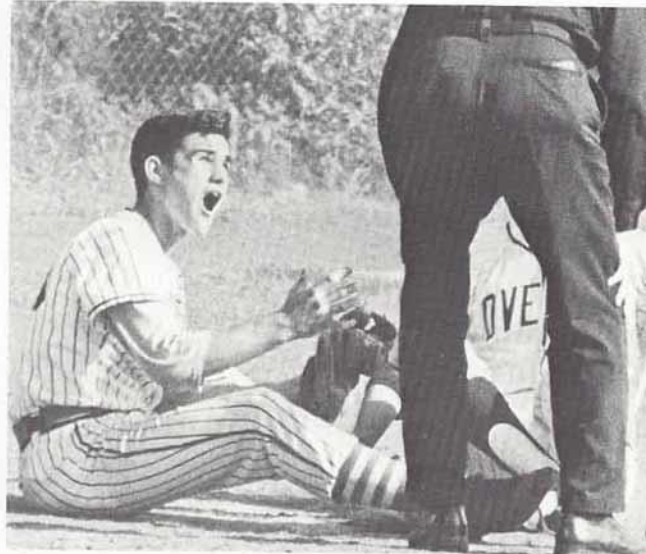
