For the Sophomores, this was the first year of Senior High, a year filled with Julius Caesar, Silas Marner, and NEDT tests.



After the game, the traditional homecoming dance was held.






Our team had an 8-2 record for the 1970 football season. Congratulations, men, you did a fantastic job.








In the 1971, 19th District Tournament, Madison came in 4th place and brought home the sportsmanship trophy. Gene Menees made the All-Tournament Team.


