Our team had an 8-2 record for the 1970 football season. Congratulations, men, you did a fantastic job.



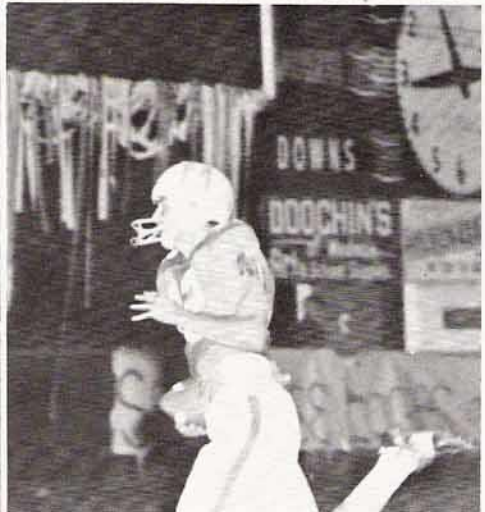
