
The year 1956 is a time to remember for Madison High School as this is the year the National Forensic League granted the club charter. In seven years it grew to receive all leading chapter award in 1964, and is in line for a second. Beginning with 10 charter members it has since swelled its ranks to fifty plus, meriting the rank of largest chapter in Tennessee and seventeenth in the nation. It is not only the largest and fastest growing, but also very proud of having the Top Student in Tennessee as well as many years ranking in the Top Ten in the Nation out of more than 350,000 plus NFL members.

### Girls' State


Last summer the student council sent Tyra Burton and Terri Woosley to Girls' State to give them an opportunity to see how state government operates.



A time to regret failure, and time to rejoice over a job well done; a time to be serious minded, and a time to enjoy all of what life has to offer.


A time to do away with false pretenses of the past, and a time to strive towards a bright future; a time to show concern for others, and a time to observe the beauty and solitude of being alone.


A time to reassure yourself, and a time to recognize your own faults; a time to push ever onward, and a time to seek wisdom of the past.
