The Student Council Committees take care of such things as the devotion, welfare, bulletin boards, letters and awards, decorations, food, and clubs.



New members accepted at mid-term were given a banquet by the other members of the society. At the banquet, the new members were formally accepted into the society and were given their membership cards.




JCL Makes Roman Dishes for Banquet






Cross Country Joins Sports






